HIRING AN INDOOR ENVIRONMENTAL PROFESSIONAL

1. VERIFY CREDENTIALS AND EXPERIENCE

- ☒ Certified (e.g., CIEC, CMC, CIH, or other recognized certifications)
- ☒ State licensing (if required in your state)
- ☒ Years of experience in indoor environmental consulting with medically affected clients
- ☒ Specializes in residential inspections
- ☒ Willing to provide references from recent clients

2. EVALUATE ASSESSMENT METHODS

- ☒ Uses clear, step-by-step inspection methods (visual inspection, moisture meter, IR, UV, borescope, etc.)
- ☒ Describes sampling methods (air, surface, dust, or bulk sampling), and uses them judiciously
- ☒ Works with accredited labs for sample analysis (not "in-house", ambient air samples, or instant results only)
- ☒ Inspection includes clear documentation and photographs

3. REVIEW REPORTING & RECOMMENDATIONS

- ☒ Provides a detailed, understandable written report (not just lab printouts)
- ☒ Report includes photos, explanations, and diagrams if needed
- ☒ Recommendations are specific and actionable-not just generic advice
- ☒ Willing to explain findings and answer your questions after the inspection

4. WATCH FOR RED FLAGS

- ☒ Can't provide proof of certification or licensing
- ☒ Unwilling to provide references
- ☒ Offers remediation or repair services as part of their own business (conflict of interest)
- ☒ Provides vague, generic, or "boilerplate" reports
- ☒ Pressures you to hire affiliated companies for follow-up work
- ☒ Doesn't provide clear pricing for the complete process: assessment, lab samples, reports, clearance testing.
